




Suicide Prevention Coalition - Walk for Awareness

Huron Behavioral Health partners with Huron County Health Department to increase harm reduction for substance use disorder in Huron County. Through this partnership we have:

- Obtained NARCAN Kits to be given out at our Agency and in the community
- Obtained NARCAN Vending Machines to Place Within our community
- Developed a Syringe Exchange Program
- Developed & Hosted Speaking Events on Awareness and Prevention



Huron Behavioral Health also partners with Great Lakes Bay Health for Primary Care Provider visits at Huron Behavioral Health, twice monthly, to make it convenient for those we serve to see their mental health and physical health providers at one location.




COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Huron Behavioral Health also puts on a Food Drive in an effort to assist with food insecurity in Huron County.






2025 - Source of Funds
